COMMUNITY IMPACT

HOPE AIR IS NOT AN AIRLINE, IT'S A LIFELINE.

For many low-income Prince George residents, accessing critical medical care means fac-



ing overwhelming barriers—traveling long distances, financial strain, or delaying vital treatments. Hope Air has been able to provide over 1,300 travel arrangements in 2023, helping families in our community reach essential care far from home.

Hope Air ensures that no patient in financial need has to cancel or delay care, offering flights, accommodations, and meals. Together,

we're making healthcare accessible and easing the burden for Prince George families during their most challenging times.

BRIDGING THE DIGITAL DIVIDE FOR SENIORS

A vital pilot project is bringing technology training to seniors in our community, addressing a growing need for digital literacy. This initiative has created a welcoming training lab

equipped with computers, desks, and supplies, and recruited skilled volunteers to provide hands-on instruction.

This program, created by Spruce Capital Seniors Recreation Society, goes beyond teaching seniors how to navigate the online world—it restores confidence, independence, and connection. By



empowering seniors to book appointments, manage tasks, and engage with family via video calls, this project strengthens their mental well-being and reduces isolation, ensuring seniors in Prince George feel connected and capable in today's digital age.

COMMUNITY IMPACT CONTINUED

CREATING ACCESSIBLE ARTS FOR ALL

Thanks to Theatre North West and a grant from the PGCF, a transformative project is making a local venue more inclusive. The addition of an Assistive Listening System and portable Stage Tlift will remove barriers for patrons with hearing impairments and mobility challenges.

This initiative ensures crystal -clear sound for all and provides Prince George's first fully accessible stage, opening opportunities for artists and audiences alike. PGCF



is proud to support this vital step toward a more inclusive and vibrant arts community.

CULTIVATING SUSTAINABILITY AND COMMUNITY

REAPS is launching the Growing Knowledge Community Compost Garden—a space to educate and inspire sustainable food production and environmental

stewardship.



Featuring food gardens, composting displays, and resources on soil health, regenerative gardening, and pollinator-friendly planting, the garden provides hands-on learning for all. Produce grown will be donated to local social

service organizations, supporting those in need while promoting sustainability.
